### **Introduction:**

The *Leaders in International Health Program Edmundo Granda Ugalde* (LIHP) was launched in 2008 as an initiative of the Pan American Health Organization. The objective of the Program is to contribute to the development of the *Health Agenda for the Americas 2008-2017* by strengthening the capacity of countries in the region to understand, act upon and positively influence the international determinants of health, to promote their national interests, and to achieve intersectoral health agreements in international environments, at all times guided by the principle of global equity in health. The Regional LIHP cohort 2009 is comprised of 35 respected professionals, who hail from ministries, academia, international agencies and non-governmental organizations from 17 countries in the region. The experience of the group has been intense, yet, at the same time, filled with important learning, reflections and developments for the participants as well as for the tutors, coordinators, and other national, regional and international actors who have accompanied the process, in which all parties contributed to a deeper conceptual understanding of international health and its components. It is with this perspective of celebration, reflection and continual development that we hold the closing/transition activity of the *Leaders in International Health Program Edmundo Granda Ugalde 2009*.

### **Objectives:**

#### *General:*

To share the principal products and accomplishments of the *Leaders in International Health Program Edmundo Granda Ugalde 2009*, to undertake an evaluation of the experience in its totality and to project the LIHP for the year 2010.

#### *Specific Objectives:*

- To share the principal products and accomplishments of the *Leaders in International Health Program Edmundo Granda Ugalde 2009*, with emphasis on the presentation of the country topics, the level of development of the International Health Situation Rooms and the interactions with the communities of practice.
- To undertake an evaluation of the LIHP 2009 with the participants, tutors, coordinators, PWRs and other relevant actors, including the conceptual, structural, administrative and technological aspects of the Program.
- Based on the experience of the LIHP 2009, to make recommendations for the LIHP 2010.
- To initiate discussions with the tutors of the LIHP 2009 regarding the 2010 Program.
